2014 JOAD National Indoor Championships

What is the JOAD National Indoor Championships? The 2014 JOAD National Indoor Championships is a separate event offered in conjunction with the U.S. National Indoor Championships over the course of four weekends at multiple regional indoor locations across the United States. Youth archers who are registered members of a JOAD club may shoot in just the JOAD National Indoor Championships, or in the U.S. National Indoor Championships, or in both events. Separate registration forms and fees must be submitted for each event.

Membership Required: Participants in the JOAD National Indoor Championships must be current members of USA Archery and members of a registered USA Archery JOAD club. Be prepared to show proof of USAA and JOAD Clubmembership at the event. If no membership can be shown, be prepared to purchase a membership to USA Archery upon arrival.

NFAA Membership Tournament Reciprocity: NFAA reciprocity membership does not apply to tournaments that require JOAD club membership. For additional information, please visit: usarchery.org.

Citizenship: Competitors must be U.S. citizens to be eligible for National titles. Non-citizens will shoot in the Guest Division.

What categories are offered?

Men's and women's recurve and compound categories for Bowmen, Cubs, Cadets and Juniors.

What rounds are offered?

Recurve Bow - One round of 60 arrows from 18 meters

Juniors and Cadets - 40 cm target face; outer 10 ring scoring

Cubs and Bowmen - 60 cm target face; outer 10 ring scoring

Compound Bow - One round of 60 arrows from 18 meters

Juniors and Cadets, - 40 cm target face; inner 10 ring scoring

Cub and Bowman - 40 cm target face; outer 10 ring scoring

Are there separate classes (age/gender)? Yes, men and women of different age groups (Bowman, Cub, Cadet, Junior) shoot in different divisions and are further categorized by equipment type.

Are there equipment or dress code rules? Yes, equipment and dress code must comply with USA Archery and World Archery rules including footwear. Visit usarchery.org for more information.

Is there registration on site at the event? No, all archers must register and pay in advance to reserve a shooting spot. Space is limited to the capacity of each venue. Register early.

How can I register? Refer to the registration forms and directions posted for each site listing. Event listings can be found at: usarchery.org.

Which Location is Best for Me? Participants may compete at any of the locations for this event noted on the USA Archery website. Residents of each region will have registration priority should any one location reach full capacity.
