

# US Archery Resident Athlete Program Criteria

## Criteria and Application

To be eligible to apply for the Resident Athlete Program, the archer must meet the Minimum Qualifying Score(FITA or double 70m) shot at a State Championships, Regional Event, USAT Qualifier Series Event, National Championships, or World Ranking Event for their current age division:

<b>Division</b>	<b>FITA Score</b>	<b>Double 70m(60m Cadets)</b>
Senior	1250 Men/1240 Women	620 Men/605 Women
Junior	1225 Men/1215 Women	600 Men/585 Women
Cadet	1275 Men and Women	625 Men/605 Women

Each applicant will be evaluated based on their past performances, rankings, physical abilities, and future potential. Athletes that are accepted into the program will be notified by July 1st. We will continue to accept applications throughout the year and fill any open positions on a case by case basis.

All accepted applicants will be placed on a 90-day trial period. After 60 days the Resident Athlete Program coaching staff will review the athlete's progress and initiation into the program. This is designed to allow both the coaches and the athlete to determine if the athlete has the potential to be successful, both in training and socially, within the structure of the current NGB resident program.

Once the athlete has successfully passed the 90-day trial period they will be granted acceptance into the program. Each resident athlete's performance will be reviewed every 6 months through the Key Performance Indicators(KPI) and this will determine the athletes continued participation in the program.
