

Katherine Kendrick currently serves as a Trustee of the United States Olympic and Paralympic Foundation (she served on the Board of Directors of the USOPF for 12 years before transitioning to a Trustee), on the Women's Leadership Board of Harvard Kennedy School, on the Advisory Board of the Los Angeles Sport and Entertainment Commission, on the Leadership Council of Waterkeepers Alliance and on the Board of Advisors of Columbia Law School Kernochan Center for Law, Media and the Arts. She is also a Founding Member of Women Against Alzheimer's, a Society of Fellows Member of the Aspen Institute and a National Council Member of the Aspen Ski and Snowboard Club.

Kendrick is the retired General Counsel and Corporate Secretary of DreamWorks Animation. She joined DreamWorks SKG as General Counsel at its formation and moved to DreamWorks Animation following its spin-off from DreamWorks SKG in an IPO. Prior to DreamWorks, Kendrick was Vice President Legal Affairs (Europe, Middle East and Africa) for the Walt Disney Company based in Paris, France and a production attorney at Walt Disney Studios based in Burbank, CA. She started her legal career as a corporate law associate at Latham & Watkins based in Los Angeles, CA.

Kendrick previously served on the Board of Directors of the Association of Professional Surfers (now the World Surf League), Big Brothers/Big Sisters of Greater Los Angeles, Los Angeles Minority Business Opportunity Council and LA's Better Educated Students for Tomorrow. In addition, she was on the Advisory Council for California State to School and the National Council of U.S. Ski and Snowboard Foundation.

Kendrick received her JD as a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar from Columbia University School of Law and her BA with highest distinction in Economics from the University of California at Berkeley.
