

World Cup stop #7: **St. Moritz, Switzerland** is a resort town in the Engadine valley in Switzerland. It is a municipality in the district of Maloja in the Swiss canton of Graubünden. The highest summit in the Eastern Alps, the Piz Bernina, lies a few kilometers south of the town. St. Moritz hosted the Winter Olympic Games in 1928 and 1948. It is one of the most expensive ski resorts in the world.

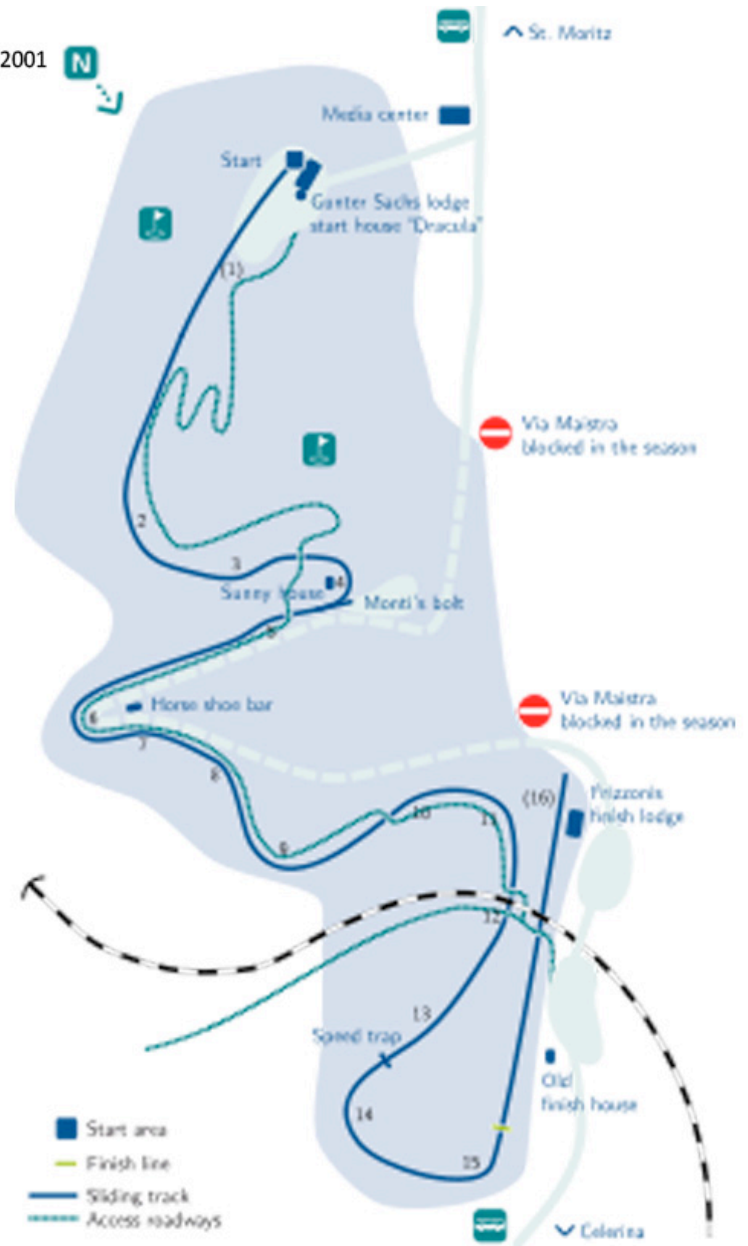
