1. SELECTION SYSTEM

1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:

1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of nomination.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the World Para Athletics Junior Championships Nottwil 2019 ("Championships").

1.1.2. Minimum International Paralympic Committee (IPC) standards for participation:

Any competitor in the World Para Athletics ("WPA") Championships must be a national of the country of the National Paralympic Committee (NPC) which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the IPC Handbook (Section 2, Chapter 3.1).

1.1.3. Minimum International Federation (IF) standards for participation (if any):

Athlete Eligibility:

As outlined in the Championships Qualification Guide, to be eligible for selection by an NPC,

Athletes must:

- Hold an active World Para Athletics Athletes License for the 2019 season;
- Be aged between 14 and 19 years old on 31 December 2019;

Guide Runners must:

- Hold an active World Para Athletics License for the 2019 season.

Age Categories:

Athletes will be divided into two age categories at the Championships as follows:

- Under 20 (U20) Men and Women: Any athlete born in 2000, 2001 or 2002
- Under 17 (U17) Boys and Girls: Any athlete born in 2003, 2004 or 2005

1.1.4. Other requirements (if any):

WPA recognized competitions are also referred to as WPA approved competitions throughout this document. It is the athlete's responsibility to ensure the events they compete in are WPA approved events and that results have been submitted prior to team selection for verification. A list of all WPA approved competitions can be found at www.paralympic.org/calendar.

Athletes with an international sport class status of N-New, R-Review, or R+2019 or earlier must undergo international classification at the Championships and must submit all relevant medical paperwork by 17 June 2019. in accordance with the WPA Athletes Licensing requirements. Athletes will need to present themselves for classification evaluation (29 July – 31 July 2019).

Athletes must complete the Competition Entry Form (CEF) online for team consideration. The CEF is open and the CEF must be completed by 14 June 2019 12:00 p.m. MDT. Detailed process for the CEF will be located on the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field website. <https://www.teamusa.org/US-Paralympics/Sports/Track-and-Field/Selection-Procedures>

Athletes age 18 or older as of the Closing Ceremony of the Championships will be required to complete the U.S. Center for Safesport's online training.

1.2. Tryout Events:

- 1.2.1. Provide the event names, dates and locations of all trials, events and camps to be used as part of the selection process.

There will be no specific tryout event for selection to the Championships. Athletes will be selected utilizing results from WPA approved competitions between 01 January 2019 and 16 June 2019 in which WPA Rules and Regulations were enforced. <https://www.paralympic.org/athletics/results/rankings>

- 1.2.2. Provide event names, dates, locations and description how athletes qualify for the trials, events and camps listed above in 1.2.1 (if any).

Not Applicable

- 1.3. Provide a comprehensive, step-by-step description of the method that explains how athletes will go through the selection process (include maximum Team size).

U.S. Paralympics Track & Field will field a maximum team size of up to twenty (20) athletes. The final Team size will be determined by implementing the selection criteria detailed herein. For purposes of the procedures, the men's and women's components of the Team shall be considered together.

General provisions as outlined in the Championships Qualification Guide:

Maximum Entry per NPC

- An NPC may enter a maximum of three (3) eligible athletes per medal event. There will be no minimum entry standards.

Event Viability Criteria

- A minimum of four (4) athlete entries from two (2) NPCs is necessary to sustain an individual medal event on the programme.
- WPA shall review the event viability following the close of the final entry by name on 20 June 2019. WPA also reserve the right to either cancel such events or run them as non-medal events.

Athletes will be selected to the Team by implementing the steps below:

Only events on the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Program (Attachment B) contested at the Championships will be considered for selection.

1.3.1. U.S. Paralympics Track & Field Ranking List

- Eighty percent (80%) of the team will be nominated using the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field ranking list. The U.S. Paralympics Track & Field Ranking List will be based off of the 2019 WPA World Rankings for events on the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games Program. The U.S. Paralympics Track & Field ranking list will be comprised of WPA verified results between 01 January 2019 - 16 June 2019.

- All WPA verified results for each eligible athlete will be given a percentage score. The score is calculated by comparing the athletes WPA verified best result per event to the 2019 National Team A standard (Attachment B). An athlete ranking list, will be created based upon this percentage. A higher percentage is better than a lower percentage.
- Only WPA verified results for each athlete, for the events as submitted on each athletes' CEF will be included in the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field ranking list.
- Slots and start rights will be filled in order of the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field ranking list (highest to lowest percentage) for the medal events scheduled to be contested at the 2020 Tokyo Paralympic Games (Attachment B).

Calculating Percentage

The percentage is calculated by comparing the athlete's best WPA verified result between 01 January 2019 and 16 June 2019 to the National Team A standard (Attachment B) using the following formula:

Track events: (2019 National Team A standard / result) X 100

Field events: (result / 2019 National Team A standard) X 100

The percentage will be calculated to two decimal points (rounded to the one-hundredth of a percent) with the higher percentage compared to the 2019 National Team A standard being the better result.

Tie Breaker

If a tie exists for a final team slot or for a final event start the percentage will be rounded three decimal points to the one-thousandth. If a tie still exists, the team slot or event start right will be selected by Discretionary Selection (Section 2). No additional information will need to be provided by the athlete in a tie break situation.

1.3.2 Discretionary Selection

Twenty percent (20%) of the team, will be selected based on the discretionary selection process as outlined in Section 2.

1.3.3 Guide Athletes

Guide athletes will be nominated based on discretionary selection process as outlined in Section 2.

CEF submissions will be published on a consolidated entry list by 14 June 2019 at 5:00 p.m. MDT. Athletes will have until 16 June 2019 at 10:00 p.m. MDT to scratch events or correct any discrepancy on the consolidated entry list. All corrections need to be emailed to usparatfteam@usoc.org by the required deadline. Resolutions will be communicated by 17 June 2019 at 5:00 p.m. MDT.

Any results that cannot be verified by 5:00 p.m. MDT on 17 June 2019 will not be considered for selection. Disqualification, scratch, did not start, did not finish results will not be considered valid.

Start Rights

Start rights remaining open after the team nominations have been filled may be assigned by the U.S. Paralympics Director, Track & Field (“Director”) to eligible athletes already nominated to the team. In assigning start rights, the Director may consult with the athlete and the relevant discipline assistant coaches. The following factors may be considered (not in priority order):

- The desire of the athlete to start the event,
- The athlete’s number of events and the time schedule of events,
- The likelihood of the athlete winning a medal in the event,
- WPA World Ranking lists, and
- 2018-2019 performances (with preference given to athletes who competed in 2019).

Universal Relay

The universal relay Team shall be determined by the Director, U.S. Paralympics Track and Field and the following factors may be considered (in no particular order):

- The athlete must be nominated to the Team and already given a start right in at least one individual event.
- Athlete results including potential to assist with a podium result at the Championships.
- Athlete sport class.
- The number and schedule of individual events in which the athlete is entered.
- The athlete's participation in relay camps and competitions in which the relay is ran.

2. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION

2.1. Provide rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

The rationale for discretionary selection is to allow U.S. Paralympics Track & Field the ability to select athletes and guide athletes based on overall impact and contribution to podium performances and slot allocations for future events.

2.2. List the discretionary criteria and explain how they will be used (if any):

Athlete Selection:

The Discretionary Selection Committee may consider input and coaching feedback from Championship coaches and staff. Athletes to be considered for discretionary selection must meet all entry and team selection deadlines and must submit a discretionary selection petition via the Competition Entry Form (CEF) by 14 June 2019, 12:00 p.m. MDT.

Performance criteria used to evaluate athletes for discretionary discretion are as follows and are not listed in priority order:

- Sole opportunity for international classification evaluation or is required to undergo international classification evaluation at the event;
- The athlete's likelihood of winning a medal at the Championships;
- If the athlete experienced an injury, illness, equipment malfunction or was unable to compete for unforeseen circumstances which impeded maximal performance between 01 January 2019 and 16 June 2019;
- The athletes best 2018 performance compared to the 2018 National Team A standard <https://www.paralympic.org/athletics/results/rankings>;
- The athletes best 2019 performance compared to the 2019 National Team A standard;
- If the athlete has achieved a verified mark at a WPA approved event between 01 January 2018 and 16 June 2019 and is ranked in the top six (6) in the respective event on the World Para Athletics Minimum Qualification Standard Ranking for the Championships as posted on the World Para Athletics website at the time of nomination;
- If an athlete has a verifiable performance that is not listed in the WPA World Rankings, but the mark approximates a top three (3) ranking in 2019;
- An athlete, who despite competing a relatively short time in the sport, is within a reasonable percentage.

Guide Athletes:

The Discretionary Selection Committee will nominate guide athletes to the Team through discretionary selection. Guide athletes are used for the T11/12 and F11/12 sport classes (visually impaired). The guide athletes are not included in the maximum team size nor are the guide athletes accounted in the 20% of total of discretionary selection as outlined above. A guide athlete will typically work with one athlete during practice, competition and day-to-day activities; therefore accreditation allocation is typically provided for one guide per qualified athlete as outlined in the WPA Rules:

<http://www.paralympic.org/Athletics/RulesandRegulations/Rules> However, accreditation allocation is not guaranteed, and the number of guide athletes will be based on final NPC (U.S. Paralympics) credential allocation from WPA.

The following may be considered in the discretionary selection of a guide athlete:

- Track events: the speed of the guide in relation to the athlete being guided.
- The guide must be faster than the visually impaired athlete.
- Field events: voice command and positioning experience.
- Preference of the qualified visually impaired athlete.
- Demonstrated expertise of the guide athlete- must have expertise and experience in the assigned athlete's specific event(s).
- Knowledge and understanding of the WPA rules pertaining to guide athletes.

Guide athletes are held to the same standards and code of conduct as outlined in these procedures. Guide position is contingent on the nomination and participation of the designated athlete to be guided. The guide athlete will be removed if the athlete the guide is assigned to is no longer eligible to compete and the guide cannot be reassigned to another athlete.

- 2.3. Provide the name of the committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections, along with a complete list of the members' titles currently serving on the committee:

U.S. Paralympics Track & Field Discretionary Selection Committee:

- Sr. High Performance Director, U.S. Paralympics
- Director, U.S. Paralympics Track & Field
- Associate Director, U.S. Paralympics
- Athlete Representative 1 (not currently on the National Team and/or competing in 2019)
- Athlete Representative 2 (not currently on the National Team and/or competing in 2019)

- 2.3.1. Specify the process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee.

Any member of the selection committee that has a possible conflict of interest must disclose it. If such conflict exists, the selection committee member must recuse him/herself from committee discussions and voting. Further, the committee member should not otherwise influence other members of the committee in the selection process. However, a committee member who recused him/herself, but who has relevant and necessary information with respect to athlete performance, for example a national team

coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the selection committee, provide such information to the committee so long as such information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and the committee member who declared the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision.

3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 3.1. Prior to entry by name to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOC, U.S. Paralympics Track & Field has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is to be nominated to the Team by U.S. Paralympics Track & Field may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the Director, U.S. Paralympics Track & Field.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by the U.S. Paralympics Track & Field, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of the U.S. Paralympics Code of Conduct (Attachment A)
- 3.1.5. Removal by the IPC/WPA of the event in which the athlete qualified for the Team, from the program of the Championships.
- 3.1.6. Re-classification of the athlete by WPA, such that the athlete's qualifying performance would not have qualified him/her for the Team.

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per the U.S. Paralympics Complaint Procedures and the USOC's Bylaws, Section 9.

- 3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOC, the USOC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable U.S. Paralympics Code of Conduct, the USOC's Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures apply. - 3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IPC, WADA, WPA, USADA and/or USOC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as applicable.

4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES

4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:

4.1.1. prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

The replacement pool of athletes will be comprised of qualified and eligible athletes. Replacement athletes will be selected via discretionary selection (Section 2). The replacement athletes are not required to submit a discretionary selection petition nor are the replacement athletes accounted in the 20% total of discretionary selection.

4.1.2. After submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

No replacement athletes will be selected after submission of final Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, 20 June 2019.

5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

U.S. Paralympics Track & Field will retain the approved selection procedures, supporting documents, and data from the selection process for six months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Championships.

6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOC Code of Conduct, the following documents are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the Championships and are included as attachments:

- USOC Code of Conduct for U.S. Paralympics National Teams and U.S. Paralympics Programs (Attachment A)
- U.S. Paralympics Complaint Procedures (Attachment D)
- Competition Entry Form
- Minor Travel Form and Policies

7. PUBLICITY/DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEDURES

The USOC approved Selection Procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by U.S. Paralympics Track & Field in the following locations:

8. DATE OF NOMINATION

The Nomination of Athletes form, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes and submitted to the USOC on or before:

Athlete nominations will be announced on or before 18 June 2019. Athletes nominated to the Team must accept/decline their nomination and event start rights via email within 24 hours of receiving nomination email. Emails must be sent to usparatfteam@usoc.org.

9. MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must adhere to all IPC, WADA, WPA, USADA and USOC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of- Competition Testing as required by the IPC, WADA, WPA, USADA and USOC Rules, as applicable.

However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures will be revised, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOC.

ATHLETE PLEDGE AND AGREEMENT

I pledge to uphold the spirit of this Code of Conduct (the “Code”), which offers a guide to my conduct as a member of a U.S. Paralympics National Team or a U.S. Paralympics Team to international competition (the “Team”). This Code applies to those Paralympic sports in which the United States Olympic Committee (USOC) has not recognized a National Governing Body or a Paralympic Sport Organization to govern the sport. I acknowledge that I have a right to a hearing if my opportunity to compete is denied or if I am charged with a violation of this Code.

I have familiarized myself with the Code and understand that acceptance of its provisions is a condition of my membership on the Team.

As a Member of the Team, I hereby promise and agree that I:

- will abide by all published rules related to the Team selection procedures as approved by U.S. Paralympics or the USOC;
- have acted and will act in a sportsmanlike manner consistent with the spirit of fair play and responsible conduct;
- will maintain a level of fitness and competitive readiness that will permit my performance to be at the maximum of my abilities;
- will notify U.S. Paralympics if (i) I have a physical injury or illness that might compromise my ability to compete; (ii) will submit, if requested, to a physical/medical examination by medical personnel approved by the USOC and authorize the submission of the physical examination/medical information to US Paralympics and the USOC; and (iii) understand that such injury or illness may be the cause for my not being selected to the Team, being removed from the Team, or not being allowed to participate if I remain on the team.
- will comply with all aspects of the SafeSport Code for the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Movements, the SafeSport Practices and Procedures for the U.S. Olympic and Paralympic Movement, the Supplementary Rules for U.S. Olympic and Paralympic SafeSport Arbitrations, and all other athlete safety policies, procedures and protocols of the USOC;
- will not commit a doping violation as defined by the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA), the United States Anti-Doping Agency (USADA), the International Paralympic Committee (IPC) or USOC rules;
- am not currently provisionally suspended or serving a period of ineligibility for a doping violation and/or do not have a pending or unresolved doping charge;
- am not currently serving a suspension or been deemed permanently ineligible due to a SafeSport violation, and I have disclosed to U.S. Paralympics any current interim measure(s) and/or unresolved SafeSport allegation made against me;
- will not engage in any conduct that is criminal under any laws applicable to me, including, but not limited to laws governing the possession and use of drugs and alcohol and providing of drugs to any person and of alcohol to minors;
- will not participate or assist in any gambling or betting activities associated with any event related to my sport or my participation;

- am eligible to compete under the rules of the IPC and its pertinent committees, and its pertinent member organizations and under the rules of the USOC;
- am in possession of a valid U.S. passport, that will not expire prior to six months following the conclusion of any international competition, should I be chosen for an international team that requires a passport;
- will refrain from conduct detracting from my ability or that of my teammates to attain peak performance;
- will respect the property of others whether personal or public;
- will maintain a level of personal hygiene and cleanliness appropriate to respect my teammates;
- will respect members of my Team, other teams, spectators and officials, and engage in no form of discriminatory behavior nor in any form of verbal, physical or sexual harassment or abuse;
- will follow the Team rules, whether set by Team leadership or adopted by consensus, including by way of example, rules regarding curfew and required attendance at Team meetings;
- agree to wear the uniforms approved by U.S. Paralympics at official activities sponsored by the USOC or U.S. Paralympics as directed by U.S. Paralympics staff, and I agree to compete in the U.S. Paralympics-approved Team uniform, where such a uniform is provided, in competitions at which I am supported by U.S. Paralympics. I agree to wear the names and logos of U.S. Paralympics sponsors, suppliers and licensees on Team competition wear, other uniforms and casual wear as provided by U.S. Paralympics. I agree to not alter any Team uniform, either by removing or obstructing the names or logos of U.S. Paralympics sponsors, suppliers and licensees or by adding patches, stickers, or other means of displaying unauthorized names, logos or messages;
- agree to not demean or defame the USOC, U.S. Paralympics or its sponsors, their names, logos, marks, products or services. I acknowledge that endorsing and supporting U.S. Paralympics sponsors through my actions and words reflects well on the team and on those supporting the team.
- agree to be filmed, videotaped and photographed, and to have my image and voice otherwise recorded, in any media, during any event I am attending under the auspices of the USOC or U.S. Paralympics, by U.S. Paralympics official photographer(s), film crew(s) and video crew(s), and by any other entity authorized by U.S. Paralympics, under the conditions specified by U.S. Paralympics. I hereby grant U.S. Paralympics the irrevocable, perpetual, fully paid-up, worldwide right and license to use, and to authorize third parties to use, in all media, my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information for: (1) news and information purposes, (2) promotion of the Paralympic movement and the specific competition(s) in which I compete, (3) promotion of the Team, and (4) promotion of U.S. Paralympics and the USOC ; in no event may U.S. Paralympics or the USOC use or authorize the use of my name, picture, likeness, voice and biographical information for the purpose of trade, including any use in a manner that would imply an endorsement of any company, product, or service, without my written permission;
- will not use or authorize the use of photographs, films or videos of myself in my USOC or Paralympic Team apparel or equipment or the use of any USOC or U.S. Paralympics logo for the purpose of trade, promotion, fundraising or on merchandise, without the prior written consent of U.S. Paralympics;
- will abide by the rules of the IPC or other Paralympic international federation concerning allowable trademark identification on clothing and equipment worn or used in competition or on my body (such as visible tattoos).

- will be responsible for payment of all legal fees and expenses if I require legal representation because I am accused of a doping violation or criminal misconduct, or if for any other reason I require the services of an attorney;
- will act in a way that will bring respect and honor to myself, my teammates, the Team, U.S. Paralympics, the USOC, and the United States; and
- will remember that at all times I am an ambassador for my sport, my country and the Paralympic Movement.

Attachment D

**U.S. Paralympics
COMPLAINT PROCEDURES
May 15, 2018**

Section 1. Jurisdiction.

These Complaint Procedures are applicable to those Paralympic sports in which U.S. Paralympics has not recognized a National Governing Body or a Paralympic Sport Organization to govern the sport.

Only matters concerning those Paralympic sports fall within the jurisdiction of these Complaint Procedures. Any member or participant of any of those Paralympic sports, by reason of membership or participation in an event (including but not limited to, competitions, camps and trainings) sanctioned, organized or held by U.S. Paralympics, agrees to be subject to these complaint procedures and agrees to be bound by any decision rendered pursuant to these complaint procedures.

Section 2. Designation of Complaints.

The following kinds of complaints may be filed with U.S. Paralympics:

- a. Administrative Grievance. U.S. Paralympics or any aggrieved individual may file a complaint pertaining to any matter relating to the cognizance of U.S. Paralympics, including but not limited to any alleged violation of or grievance concerning any U.S. Paralympics rule, regulation or code of conduct.
- b. Disciplinary Proceeding. U.S. Paralympics, or any member of the respective Paralympic sport may file a complaint against another member of the Paralympic sport, or former member of the Paralympic sport if the action occurred while the individual was a member, regarding any alleged violation of the Paralympic sport Code of Conduct, Paralympic sport SafeSport Policy, or any other rule or regulation relating to conduct.
- c. Right to Compete. Any athlete, coach, trainer, manager, administrator or official may file a complaint pertaining to any alleged denial, or alleged threat to deny, of that individuals opportunity to compete in a U.S. Paralympics sanctioned/sponsored competition or protected competition.

Section 3. Manner of Filing.

The complainant shall file the complaint with the USOC Chief Executive Officer. The complaint shall set forth in clear and concise language, preferably in numbered paragraphs: (i) the alleged violation, grievance, denial or threat to deny and (ii) the remedy requested. The complainant shall sign the complaint, except that for matters involving any Paralympic sport SafeSport Policy, complaints may be filed anonymously.

Section 4. Statute of Limitations.

A complaint filed under these Complaint Procedures shall be filed within one hundred and eighty (180) days of the occurrence of the alleged violation, grievance, denial or threat to deny.

Section 5. Field of Play Decisions.

The final decision of a referee during a competition regarding a field of play decision (a matter set forth in the rules of the competition to be within the discretion of the referee) shall not be reviewable through the procedures for, or the subject of, Administrative Grievances or Right to Compete Complaints unless the decision is: (i) outside the authority of the referee to make or (ii) the product of fraud, corruption, partiality or other misconduct of the referee. For purposes of this Section, the term "referee" shall include any individual with discretion to make field of play decisions.

Section 6. Doping Decisions.

A decision concerning a doping violation adjudicated by the independent anti-doping organization designated by U.S. Paralympics to serve as the U.S. National Anti-Doping Organization (currently the United States Anti-Doping Agency) shall not be reviewable through, or the subject of, these complaint procedures.

Section 7. Safe Sport Decisions.

A decision concerning a safe sport violation adjudicated by the independent safe-sport organization designated by U.S. Paralympics (currently the United States Center for Safe Sport) shall not be reviewable through, or the subject of, these complaint procedures.

Section 8. Hearing Panel.

Upon the filing of a complaint, the USOC Chief Executive Officer shall appoint a hearing panel consisting of three (3) disinterested individuals to hear the complaint. The USOC Chief Executive Officer shall also appoint a chair of the hearing panel from among the three individuals appointed. At least one member of the hearing panel shall be an athlete. The Hearing Panel shall be responsible to ensure that all complaints are heard in a timely, fair and impartial manner.

Section 9. Administration.

The United States Olympic Committee General Counsel's Office shall generally administer and oversee all administrative grievances, disciplinary proceedings, and right to compete matters filed with U.S. Paralympics.

Section 10. Conduct of the Proceeding.

The hearing panel shall rule on all motions and other matters raised in the proceeding. If the complaint is not dismissed, the hearing panel shall hold a hearing on the complaint. The hearing panel shall set such timelines and other rules regarding the proceeding and the conduct of the hearing as it deems necessary. The hearing shall be informal, except that testimony shall be taken under oath.

The hearing may be conducted by teleconference, if necessary or convenient to the parties. Each party shall have the right to appear personally or through a legal representative. All parties shall be given a reasonable opportunity to present and examine evidence, cross-examine witnesses and to present argument. Members of the hearing panel shall have the right to question witnesses or the parties to the proceeding at any time.

Any party may have a record made of the hearing. A court reporter may be present at the hearing at the request of a party. The court reporter shall be paid for by the party requesting the court reporter, or if mutually agreed, the cost may be equally divided. Any transcript shall be paid for by the party requesting the transcript.

Section 11. Expedited Procedures.

Upon the request of a party, and provided that it is necessary to expedite the proceeding in order to resolve a matter relating to a competition that is so scheduled that compliance with regular procedures would not be likely to produce a sufficiently early decision to do justice to the affected parties, the USOC Chief Executive Officer is authorized to order that the complaint be heard and decided within forty-eight (48) hours of the filing of the complaint. In such a case, the hearing panel is authorized to hear and decide the complaint pursuant to such procedures as are necessary, but fair to the parties involved.

Section 12. Complaints Involving Selection to Participate in a Competition.

Where a complaint is filed involving selection of an individual to participate in a competition, the complainant shall include with the complaint a list of all other individuals, together with their contact information, that may be adversely affected by a decision rendered on the complaint. The hearing panel shall determine which additional individuals must receive notice of the complaint. The complainant shall then be responsible for providing appropriate notice to these individuals. Any individual so notified then shall have the option to participate in the proceeding as a party. If an individual is notified of the complaint, then that individual shall be bound by the decision of the hearing panel even though the individual chose not to participate as a party.

Section 13. Decision.

A decision shall be determined by a majority of the hearing panel. The hearing panel's decision shall be in writing, shall state the reasons for the decision and shall be distributed to the parties.

Section 14. Arbitration.

Any party may appeal a decision of the hearing panel to the American Arbitration Association. The arbitrator appointed by the American Arbitration Association shall have the authority to hear the matter anew or if requested by a party to render a decision on a more limited review. Either party may submit the decision of the hearing panel to the arbitrator for the arbitrator's consideration. The arbitrator may give whatever weight or authority to the hearing panel's decision as the arbitrator deems appropriate.
