ATHLETE SELECTION PROCEDURES
2023 Men's North American and Caribbean and World Beach Games Team-Beach Handball
November 2, 2022

1. SELECTION SYSTEM

1.1. Provide the minimum eligibility requirements for an athlete to be considered for selection to the Team:

1.1.1. Nationality/Passport requirements:

Athlete must be a national of the United States at the time of selection.

Athlete must hold a valid U.S. passport that will not expire for six months after the conclusion of the Games.

1.1.2. Minimum standards for participation:

Any competitor in the World Beach Games must be a national of the country of which is entering such competitor. For additional information regarding an athlete who is a national of two or more countries, has changed his or her nationality or acquired a new nationality, refer to the Olympic Charter (Rule 41), the IPC Handbook (Section 2, Chapter 3.1), the International Handball Federation rules and regulations, or the Americas Paralympic Committee bylaws (Chapter 2.4.12 of the IPC Handbook).

1.1.3. Minimum International Federation (IF) and/or Continental Federation (CF) (NACHC only) standards for participation (if any):

Athletes must be at least 16 years old at the start of competition.

1.1.4. Other requirements (if any):

- Athlete must successfully complete all Games Registration requirements by stated deadline.
- Athletes must meet all health and safety protocols, to include vaccine requirements and/or testing requirements set forth by the government, USOPC, the IF and/or the local organizing committee.
- Any athlete age 18 or older will be required to undergo a background screen in accordance with the current [USOPC Background Check Policy](#).



- Any athlete age 18 or older as of the Closing Ceremony will be required to remain current with the U.S. Center for SafeSport’s education and training requirements in accordance with the [USOPC Athlete Safety Policy](#).

1.2. Tryout Events:

USATH’s selection criteria is a dynamic process whereby all available and eligible athletes are assessed in all below listed activities, including upcoming activities as posted on the USATH website.

1.2.1. Event names, dates and locations of all trials, competitions, and camps to be used as part of the selection process:

- Any official IHF, EHF, NACHC or European Club tournaments in 2022 through May 1, 2023
- Any USATH sanctioned tournament in 2022 through May 1, 2023
- Open Invitation Team Camps: November 12th-13th, 2022, January 28th-29th, 2023, March 4th -5th, 2023 and April 8th-9th, 2023.

The events at which athletes will be evaluated are subject to change.

The events above, are used for both evaluation to the Pool and evaluation to the North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team. Selection to one or more events does not guarantee selection to future events.

Dates for any events, trials or camps will be announced and posted on USATH’s website <https://www.teamusa.org/USA-Team-Handball> at least forty-five (45) days prior to the commencement of the evaluations and events. The athletes will be advised of any change in events at which they will be evaluated at least forty-five (45) days prior to such event.

1.2.2. Describe how athletes qualify for the events listed in section 1.2.1 The following athletes are eligible for selection to the Men’s North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team Pool 2023:

Athletes are selected to the pool by the Head of Beach Programs and Men’s National Team Head Coach (in consultation with the National Teams coaching staff and high performance staff). High Performance staff will evaluate and will collect information about an athlete’s performance from 2019-2023 for placement in the pool.



Athletes who are member of the pool may include the following:

- Athletes selected as a member of a USA Team Handball Men’s Beach National Team
- Athletes identified through performance in professional team handball leagues.
- Athletes identified through collegiate team handball programs
- Athletes identified by submitting sport videos or other relevant data to the National Team coaching and high-performance staff
- Athletes participating in the following events and who are invited to be a part of the national team pool
 - Any official IHF, EHF, NACHC or European Club tournaments in 2022 through May 1, 2023
 - Any USATH sanctioned tournament in 2022 through May 1, 2023
 - Open Invitation Team Camps: November 12th-13th, 2022, January 28th-29th, 2023, March 4th -5th, 2023 and April 8th-9th, 2023.

The following athletes are eligible for selection to the Men’s NACHC & World Beach Games Senior Team Pool 2023:

- i. All athletes 16 years of age or older at the start of competition, who bare a US Passport and have competed in a USA Team Handball sanctioned event.
- ii. Athletes who have been selected as a member of a USA Team Men’s Beach Handball National Team, during the period commencing on January 1, 2022 through the day of selection.
- iii. Athletes invited to a USA Team Beach Handball Training Camps during the 2022/2023 period.

Participation in any Men’s 2022 or 2023 Beach Handball National Team activities does not guarantee selection to the Men’s 2023 North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team.

- 1.3. Step-by-step description of the selection process for these Games (include maximum Team size):

At the Evaluative activities described above, one (1) or more members of the North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team Selection Committee (NACHCWBGSC) will observe and evaluate athletes. Observation and evaluation duties may be divided among the members of the NACHCWBGSC and each member’s observations will be reported to the other members of the committee. Athletes will be observed and evaluated in

accordance with procedures outlined herein using the selection criteria. It is intended that the observation and evaluation of athletes will be an ongoing process.

As indicated in these Selection Procedures, it is possible that each athlete being considered in selection to the Men's 2023 North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team may not have been observed at the same evaluative events or as many evaluative events as other athletes also being considered for the Men's 2023 North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team.

Selection Criteria:

In selecting athletes to be members of the Men's 2023 North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team, the NACHCWBGSC will consider information, specifically observations and statistical evaluations, both objective and discretionary data will be utilized.

1. Preference will be given to those athletes with National Team experience
2. Athletes will be evaluated on competencies in the following areas with additional accounting for level of competitive play:

Positive/Negative individual action
Positive/ Negative collaboration action
Positive/Negative Team action
Positive/Negative Specialized action
Follow-Up action

Description of the actions:

Phases: Attack: Turnovers/Shots/Blocks/Off-Target actions/Penalties

Defense: Defensive Impact Zones, Defensive's duel readiness, Interceptions (dynamic vs static), Collaboration with the goalie, Zonal Collaboration, transformations and permutates.

Goalkeeping: fastbreak initiation, Goal Impact zones' success, Saving percentages

Technical Gestures per positions:

- a. Backcourts: Suspension shot, breakthrough actions, 1-on-1 actions, collaboration actions. Positional play readiness, and execution of set plays.
- b. Pivots: adaptability, somatic control, multidimensional receptions, blocks, Ideal use of space, collaboration with first line of attack, and 6 meters shot's efficacy.
- c. Wing: counterattack readiness, aborted fastbreaks, positive fastbreaks' efficiency, corner shots, 1-on-1 actions, transformations to backcourt and to second pivots.
- d. Goalkeeping: Saving efficacy per goal's zones, effective use of the goal are, efficiency on outside shots, breakthrough shots and through shots, fastbreak initiation, and technical-tactical readiness, use of defense.



Additionally, all candidates will be evaluated on their ability to perform Beach Handball-related technical gestures. The evaluation will assess the players' aptitude to execute Beach Handball-related actions that are required at the international and high performing level. The athletes are expected to perform position-related movements and multidimensional executions of these technical-tactical actions during evaluation camps and games. The technical actions are not limited to spin shots, in-flight shots, one-on-one situations on defense and offense, defensive control of their playing position as well as understanding of their objective as an attacker. The players must be able perform a good repertoire of shooting techniques, as well as to show understanding of the concepts of continuation, payers' fixation and multidimensional assist to their teammates.

Key Attributes:

- Preferred Hand
- Preferred position
- International Level Handball Specific Fitness
- International Competitive Readiness

Other Attributes:

- a. teamwork,
- b. coachability,
- c. attitude
- d. mental toughness

On or before the nomination date, the Men's NACHCWBGSC will select 10 athletes and replacements per IHF, NACHC and WBG rules, from among the Pool, to the North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team. The selections will be based on the selection criteria (Section 1.3. and Section 2.) and include the cumulative statistical, video tape, written, and observational evaluations from the Men's NACHCWBGSC.

2. DISCRETIONARY SELECTION (if applicable)

2.1. Rationale for utilizing discretionary selection (if any):

The sport of team handball is not a measured or timed event. In the selection of athletes who will compete together as a team, it is difficult to make selection decisions based solely upon objective criteria. The fact that various positions on the team (offense, goalkeeper, defense) require different physical and mental attributes must be considered. It is the belief of the NACHCWBGSC that considering the mix of Selection Criteria, which includes discretionary components in evaluation of performance ability and listed considerations, will result in selection of the best athletes, who will work together as an effective team, to continue the success of this program.

2.2. Define the discretionary criteria to be used (if any):

In selecting athletes to be members of the 2023 North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team, the NACHCWBGSC will consider information, specifically observation and statistical evaluation, of both objective and discretionary nature, that pertains to the criteria listed here and in Section 1.3.

The selection procedures of a team handball player has to concern itself with the individual's overall performance and his/her contribution to the performance of the team as a whole in interaction with the other players. Cumulative Performance Evaluation, and/or systematic participation will be considered as a fundamental requirement for selection.

2.3. Name of the committee that will be responsible for making discretionary selections, along with a complete list of the members' titles:

The NACHCWBGSC, which includes the requisite minimum of 33.3 percent of athlete representation, is responsible for making all athlete selections for the North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team.

2.3.1. Process that will be used to identify and handle any potential conflicts of interest involving a member of the committee:

All members of the selection committee must comply with the NGB/PSO's conflict of interest policy, to include completing and submitting a disclosure form

for review by the NGB/PSO's Ethics Committee prior to convening the committee.

Any member of the selection committee who has an actual, possible, or perceived conflict of interest must disclose it to the NGB/PSO's Ethics Committee prior to the start of the selection process and/or recuse him/herself from the review process and/or voting. A conflict of interest exists when a personal, family, financial, professional, club, team or business interest of the committee member poses a direct or indirect relationship, connection, or affiliation, past or present, with an athlete in contention for the applicable team selection that could compromise the committee member's ability to participate in the selection process in an unbiased manner. If a conflict exists, the NGB/PSO's Ethics Committee shall review the conflict and determine the committee member's level of involvement (e.g., whether that committee member must recuse him/herself from participating in discussions and/or voting). For example, if it is determined that a committee member must recuse him/herself from voting, the Ethics Committee may still determine that a committee member who has relevant and necessary information with respect to athlete performance, for example a national team coach or high performance director, may, if requested by the selection committee, provide such information to the committee so long as such information is provided in a fair and unbiased manner and so long as the committee member with the conflict of interest does not vote toward the final decision. The committee member must not otherwise influence other members of the committee in the selection process.

Additionally, any person (including any potentially impacted athlete or coach of a potentially impacted athlete) with a good faith belief that a committee member has a conflict of interest may report the alleged conflict of interest to NGB/PSO's Ethics Committee. Reports may be made anonymously. No committee member shall retaliate in any way against a person who, in good faith, reports an alleged conflict of interest.

Any recused individual shall be replaced in accordance with the NGB/PSO selection committee appointment process.

3. REMOVAL OF ATHLETES

- 3.1. Prior to entry by name to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, the NGB/PSO has jurisdiction over potential nominees.

An athlete who is nominated to the Team by USA Team Handball may be removed for any of the following reasons, as determined by USA Team Handball:

- 3.1.1. Voluntary withdrawal. Athlete must submit a written letter to the USA Team Handball CEO/Executive Director.
- 3.1.2. Injury or illness as certified by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Team Handball. If an athlete refuses verification of his/her illness or injury by a physician (or medical staff) approved by USA Team Handball, his/her injury will be assumed to be disabling and he/she may be removed.
- 3.1.3. Failure to participate in Mandatory Training and/or Competition as defined in Section 9 of these procedures.
- 3.1.4. Violation of the USA Team Handball Code of Conduct (Appendix A).
- 3.1.5. Non-compliance with the eligibility requirements listed in Section 1.1. of these selection procedures.
- 3.1.6. An athlete selected as a member of the Men's North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team, may be recommended for removal from the Team by the NACHCWBGSC for any action determined by the selection committee to be detrimental to a Team, USA Team Handball or any USA Team Handball athlete, coach or staff member. If an athlete is recommended for removal from the Team, he/shewill receive written notification of such removal recommendation from the selection committee in advance of the USATH CEO's approval of his or her removal.

An athlete who is removed from the Team pursuant to this provision has the right to a hearing per USA Team Handball's Bylaws, Article 14 or the USOPC's Bylaws, Section 9.

- 3.2. Once athlete entries have been submitted to the Local Organizing Committee by the USOPC, the USOPC has jurisdiction over the Team, at which time, in addition to any applicable NGB/PSO Code of Conduct, the USOPC's Code of Conduct and Grievance Procedures apply. The USOPC's Code of Conduct is included in the Games Forms made available prior to the respective Games; the USOPC's Grievance Procedures can be found at:

- 3.3. An athlete may be removed as a nominee to the Team or from the Team for an adjudicated violation of IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and/or USOPC anti-doping protocol, policies and procedures, as well as the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, the USOPC Athlete Safety Policy and USA Team Handball's SafeSport policies, as applicable.

4. REPLACEMENT OF ATHLETES

- 4.1. Describe the selection and approval process for determining replacement athlete(s) should a vacancy occur:
 - 4.1.1. prior to submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:



The NACHCWBGSC will from initial selection, identify potential replacements for each position. The selection committee using the criteria in Sections 1.3. and 2. shall fill the vacancy with an athlete that best meets the criteria needed to fulfill game strategy.

- 4.1.2. after submission of Entries by Name to the Local Organizing Committee, including any applicable group or committee:

The selection committee will from initial selection, identify potential replacements each for each position. The selection committee using the criteria in Sections 1.3. and 2. shall fill the vacancy with an athlete that best meets the criteria needed to fulfill game strategy

5. SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

USA Team Handball will retain the approved Selection Procedures and all supporting documents, including scouting or evaluation forms, etc., and data from the selection process for six months past the date of the Closing Ceremony of the Games.

6. REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

In addition to the USOPC Code of Conduct, the documents listed in Appendix A are required to be signed by an athlete as a condition of nomination to the North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team.

7. PUBLICITY/DISTRIBUTION OF PROCEDURES

The USOPC approved Selection Procedures (complete and unaltered) will be posted/published by USA Team Handball in the following public location(s):

These procedures will be posted as soon as possible, but not more than five business days following notice of approval by the USOPC.

8. DATE OF NOMINATION

Nomination of athletes, including replacements, will be announced to all athletes and submitted to the USOPC on or before:



May 1, 2023

9. MANDATORY TRAINING AND/OR COMPETITION

Specify the location, schedule and duration of mandatory training and/or competition:

A specific training program will be developed for athletes selected to the 2023 North American and Caribbean Handball Confederation and World Beach Games Team. Once the program is developed, affected athletes will be informed as soon as possible, but no later than 30 days prior, regarding mandatory training, or competitions. Each member of the selected Team is expected to participate in the developed program of training.

All requests for waivers from participation in mandatory events must be presented to the NACHCWBGSC in writing prior to the event. As soon as practical after receipt of the request, the NACHCWBGSC will review the request and approve or deny it. All waivers must be granted by the NACHCWBGSC in writing.

10. ANTI-DOPING REQUIREMENTS

Athletes must adhere to all IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, **NACHC, WBG**, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC anti-doping protocols, policies and procedures, as applicable. This includes participation in Out-of-Competition Testing as required by the IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, NACHC, WBG, APC, WADA, IF, USADA and USOPC rules, as applicable.

Any change in the selection procedures caused by a change in IOC, IPC, Panam Sports, NACHC, WBG, APC, as applicable, and/or your IF/CF rules and regulations will be distributed to the affected athletes immediately. The selection criteria are based on the latest information available to USA Team Handball. However, the selections are always subject to unforeseen, intervening circumstances, and realistically may not have accounted for every possible contingency.

If any force of nature, or force majeure, should cause the alteration or cancellation of any of the selection events listed in this document, these selection procedures may require revisions, pursuant to their resubmission to the USOPC.

14. ATHLETE OMBUDS OFFICE

The Athlete Ombuds Office provides cost-free, independent and confidential advice regarding athlete rights, grievance procedures and any other related guidance pertaining to selection procedures and can assist in mediating disputes between athletes and their NGB/PSO.



