Day 3 Highlights from the ISU's World Cup Speed Skating in Salt Lake City

Brittany Bowe picks up fourth medal of weekend, setting World Record in 1000-meter

Team USA concluded the ISU World Cup Speed Skating in Salt Lake City with 10 overall medals, after closing out the third and final day of competition with a gold and bronze in the women's 1000m.

Brittany Bowe (Ocala, Fla.) wowed the crowd with a world record performance in the 1000m with a time of 1:12.18. Entering the World Cup season, Bowe held the 1000m record but last weekend in Calgary saw teammate **Heather Bergsma** (High Point, N.C.) set a new mark at 1:12.51. Paired in an event with Bergsma for the fourth time this weekend, Bowe skated a blistering 17.64 opening 200m to set the pace for her world record skate.

Highlights from Day 3 (Nov. 22)

- The United States set multiple world records on back-to-back weekends.
- With **Bowe's** first place finish in the 1000m, it was her seventh podium trip over the first two World Cups (2 gold, 3 silver, 2 bronze).
- **Bergsma** collected her third medal of the weekend, sixth of the year with the third place finish in the 1000m (1:13.45).
- **Paige Schwartzburg** finished third in the Women's Mass Start B Division.
- In the Men's B Division, **Joey Mantia** won the Mass Start and will move up to the A Division in the next World Cup.

Quotes from Brittany Bowe

- "It's tough to go under world record-pace and come home with a silver medal. I've done that two weekends in a row but I use that as motivation to get back on top the following day."
- "It's pretty special what Heather [Bergsma] and I are doing, along with the other girls - four of us went under 1:13 last weekend. What Heather and I have going on is pretty special, battling back and forth breaking world records every time we've skated this year."
